Katharina Stibrant Sunnerhagen | Sweden

Katharina Stibrant Sunnerhagen is Chair of Rehabilitation Medicine at the University of Gothenburg and Senior Consultant at Sahlgrenska University Hospital. A leading expert in stroke research since the 1990s, her work spans muscle function, cognition, spasticity, and technology-assisted rehab. She has authored over 380 peer-reviewed publications (H-index 81) and serves on numerous national and international boards, including the Swedish Stroke Organization and ESPRM. Prof. Sunnerhagen has received several prestigious awards for her contributions to post-acute stroke rehabilitation and continues to combine research, teaching, and clinical care across the neurorehabilitation continuum.

Jaro Karppinen | Finland

Jaro Karppinen is Emeritus Professor of Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine at the University of Oulu, Finland, and Director of Rehabilitation Services in South Karelia. He is a leading researcher in musculoskeletal disorders, particularly low back pain and sciatica, with over 320 peer-reviewed publications and an H-index of 67. His research spans environmental, metabolic, and genetic risk factors, with current focus on Albased MRI analytics, biopsychosocial care models, and population-level rehabilitation. Prof. Karppinen has been a member of the European Academy of Rehabilitation Medicine since 2012.





François Rannou | France

François Rannou is Professor of Medicine at the University Paris Descartes and a specialist in Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine at Cochin Hospital, Paris. His clinical and research work focuses on musculoskeletal disorders, osteoarthritis, pain management, and regenerative therapies. A recognized leader in PRM, Prof. Rannou has authored numerous peer-reviewed publications and is actively involved in advancing translational research in rehabilitation medicine.
